Dear Brother Jeffrey,

Your good letter of July 18th duly came to hand, and Mrs. Cadman and I greatly appreciated your kindness in sending us all the news. Yes, it was very nice you were able to attend the two councils, and I regret that seemingly we will not be able to get to any at all, as we are expecting to leave this land early next Spring for Eng. and France and the field. But I praise GOD for the way things are going in our Alliance. I am tremendously pleased with our leadership, especially with dear Bro. Shuman being president. Since becoming an Alliance missionary I have seen and had enough of the "superman" idea of leadership. It hinders GOD from fully working out HIS will in our work.

Praise GOD for the three new missionary recruits in France. Mrs. Cadman and I are hoping to get more deeply acquainted with the people in the French churches who are willing to pay the full price and come out wholly for the LORD. We are trusting the LORD for another two spirit-filled couples for Indochina. We realize the tremendous difficulties before us, but GOD IS ABLE. At our recent conference I believe ALL were desirous of having more French couples in our midst. The Cochinchina opposition has now made the southern folks realize what it means to have to stand still in the development of the work, and the need of French missionaries to be the wedge and go before us so that we can follow after. Strange to say in several cases where I was spoken to about this matter I had to put the brake on! Nobody in our mission more appreciates the difficulties before us and the adjustments that will be necessary as we accept French missionaries as members of our mission! My limit for two or three years is three couples, and then see how it works.

I am willing to assume responsibility regarding the diplomas, but I would most strongly urge you to see about it yourself. Have Bro. Olsen send you written copy of French, Annamese, and Chinese lettering, etc., then get busy in Paris in one of the biggest printing presses. They will do the job for us. It may cost a few dollars, but do not be too economical in the matter. I will not trouble any more about this matter. We will not be back in Indochina in time to bring them with us, but you can do ~~all~~ everything necessary right in France.

The LORD is giving us many open doors here in the West. Our object is to encourage advance work, and so we are putting in a week here in this wealthy section, speaking daily in a tent, with Bro. Newberry directing the meetings, etc. We are trusting GOD that by giving these folks the missionary vision ~~that~~ something definite will result, and perhaps an Alliance branch opened. Pray for this. We have still two more weeks in this district, and then we are leaving for California and across the States. We now have a 1926 Tudor
