It is a marvelous thing to experience the faithfulness of our God these days. Despite difficulties and uncertainties, the Lord has shown His favor upon this work in more ways than we can know. Your very generous gift of \$25.00 toward the new mission house for Carolyn and Dorothy Moos is greatly appreciated. Our hearts are filled with thanksgiving to Him, and it is a great joy to acknowledge receipt of your gift. Thank you with full hearts for your help.

The house was to have been finished on August the 15th, but as with most such projects out here, there has been delay. The gifts that have come in this month have enabled us to start work again on it and I hope that within a month's time, it will be finished. I believe the girls will be very comfortable in it and they will have all conveniences including a lovely view of rolling fields and jungle. When it is finished we shall be happy to send you a photograph.

The Tribes Mission has just been saddened with the loss of one of our splendid nurses, Miss Rachel Peatee of Pleiku. She was helping out at the Dalat Home and School temporarily and she was stricken with Dengue fever and passed away suddenly.

As we have already mentioned in our circulars, several of our preachers had to be laid off because of the critical financial situation. There was not sufficient money to pay them during the last two months. In spite of this several of them agreed to carry on their ministries and trust the Lord for their needs. One Godly mother sold her earrings and bracelets to help support her preacher son. In another new center the young Christians said they would share their food with their young preacher rather than lose him. This

month the Lord has graciously sent in sufficient to help these needy preachers with at least one month's allowance. We find that this difficult situation has had a beneficial effect on our Christian people. We rejoice that their faith will be encouraged with this month's extra help.

We are counting on your prayers as we plan definite advances into new areas. We hope it will be possible to continue our Bible School throughout most of the year and train many new workers that will be presenting themselves as they are demobilizing from the Army.
