- p. 461 Jan. 7 - Mr. Cadman apparently had left South China for Annam.
- p. 463 A committee of four were appointed to draft a letter to the Board regarding the Hosler press matter and be ready at the next Ex. Com. meeting.
- p. 464 Jan. 18 - Mr. Hosler present and reported progress regarding a vacation place for Vietnam missionaries but nothing definite yet.
- p. 465 Mr. Hosler reported that Grace Hazenberg had moved from a native house that was first rented (\$18.00 per month) to another thatch-roofed house (\$7.00 per month). This arrangement valid through *May or June*
- p. 466 Miss Vo thi Thu was appointed Bible woman in DaNang at \$6.00 per month.  
Salary of Mr. Pham dinh That raised to \$11.00 per month (from \$10.00)
- p. 467 Jan. 19 The letters pertaining to the transfer of Mr. Cadman to Vietnam were read and discussed. Mr. Hosler was requested to write to the Board regarding his changed attitude since he wrote the letter in October 1914. Executive Committee also wrote an accompanying letter.  
In his letter Mr. Hosler regretted that he had misunderstood the action and intentions of the Committee, that he had misunderstood that the matter concerning the press had been a proposition from the Board. Also he wrote that he did not intend to leave an unfavorable impression re. Mr. Cadman in his letter of October 1914. He had presumed that he was in charge of the publications and had resisted Mr. Cadman taking it from him.  
  
Mr. Hosler stated that he would discontinue further negotiations with British and Foreign and Bible Society; that the Committee appointed at Conference would continue the correspondence re. the publishing of Mark's Gospel with a view to securing an unrestricted issue for Vietnam.
- p. 473 Apr. 9 - Dr. Glover was present at the Executive Committee meeting. He was chairman in Central China. Had been a missionary in South China.
- p. 475 Dr. Glover reported of his visit with Mr. Hess to Vietnam, that "a change of government has been effected on that field." The two men recommended that Vietnam no longer be under the South China Executive Committee, but under a superintendent, - Mr. Hess, and that they appoint an Advisory Committee in Vietnam to work with him.  
Correspondence regarding the publication of Vietnamese Scriptures was committee to R. A. Jaffray with copies of the correspondence to be given to Mr. Hess.

- p. 480 Apr. 12 - 25% of the funds in the transportation account were transferred to the Vietnam treasury to provide furlough transportation immediately for Mr. Soderberg.
- p. 482 Sept. 1 - The South China and Vietnam Mission accounts had been separated and a new account opened in the bank for Vietnam.
- p. 484 Oct. 28 - Mr. Jaffray present at the Ex. Com. meeting. He was appointed Vice chairman of the Ex. Com. in view of Mr. Hess's pending two month visit to Vietnam.
