Just a line or two to thank you and Mrs. Jeffrey and the ladies for your most kind hospitality while we were in Tourane. We had a most pleasant and enjoyable voyage to Haiphong, the steamer accommodations being good, the food wholesome, and the sea quite calm. The LORD gave me a gracious healing touch for which we praise HIM. Mrs. Cadman has some infection or other in one of her eyes which is very sore and painful. We believe the LORD is meeting her for this.

In leaving Tourane I forgot to secure from you the mss. sent you last April. It is the mss. on Bible Difficulties. Will you kindly send it to me as soon as possible by registered post? Many thanks.

I suppose it is in order to write a few lines in the "Call" regarding the change of chairmen in the mission. As both Mrs. Cadman and myself have private and personal feelings about this matter we would be much obliged if you would kindly write a few lines of appreciation of our late chairman and follow with a few lines of welcome to the new chairman. Of course you will sign your name to this. "The mills of GOD grind slowly, but they grind exceeding small."

We are delighted to get back to our own work once more. Last night right away there were several men very interested in the Gospel, and one young man came who has been attending for months and asked for baptism. He works in the postoffice. He is very promising material. Pray for him.

Our big consignment of paper has been delayed in Saigon, therefore the presses are standing still for a few days, having run out of paper. We hope to resume our translation work as soon as Mrs. Cadman's eyes get better. The first consignment of paper for the Bible is in the consignment now on the way and which should arrive in Haiphong this week. We are exceedingly anxious to get through with the Bible and feel more freedom in our work and actions.

Now I must come to a close. Mrs. Cadman joins with me in sending our kindest regards to you and Mrs. Jeffrey trusting that little Ruthie is keeping well.
