LLK and WWK--

NGUYEN VAN CHI telephoned this morning to ask if Mr. Frank Irwin had yet returned to Viet Nam, because he had a message he wanted to relay to him. Mr. Chi's address is 6105 42nd Avenue, Apt. C101, Hyattsville, Maryland 20781. His office telephone: (301) 982-6068; his residence telephone, (301) 699-1739. After he had finished talking--for one half hour--I told him we'd report if we were able to do anything concerning the following:

- . Mr. Chi's brother-in-laws and sisters have had mailed to them at the U. S. Consulate in Saigon their immigration papers signed by Henry Kissinger--BUT they have not been able to get into the Embassy. They have received the carbons, but apparently to get into to Embassy they have to be in the company of an American. They apparently cannot be shipped out on the basis of the carbons only. Mr. Chi asks Mr. Irwin--or Mr. Stebbins if he is the one to get back into Saigon--to contact his brothers-in-law and sisters and help them get into the Embassy. The address:

Mr. Chi also has a cousin who has had mailed to him a letter of support signed by a Mr. Nong, but the mail has apparently held up delivery at that end. Can Mr. Irwin do anything about getting Mr. MEO TAN TRAN at 214 Cong Ly, Saigon (telephone: 20169) out, with the understanding that Mr. Nong will send another letter of support to the Philippines or Guam or wherever needed.

Also, Mr. Chi's fiancee's family needs to be ~~EVACUATED~~ evacuated. Mr. Chi himself--a recognized immigrant to the U.S.--guarantees their support. Her Name: Christian TRAN TUYET MINH at 384/58 Cong Ly, Saigon. Mr. MEO TAN TRAN mentioned above could get in touch with her if Mr. Irwin will telephone him.
