FIRST WEEK

Monday evening, February 2 - Committee meeting opened with prayer,

MEMBERS PRESENT

All the members were present, namely; Messrs Irwin, Cadman, Jeffrey, Hammond and H. A. Jackson.

DISCUSSION OF NATIVE WORKERS Owing to the Native Conference being in session, the Executive Committee was only able to meet for one or two hours daily. Between February second and February seventh, the Committee met each native worker and Bible School Student, discussed their appointments for the coming year and had prayer with them individually.

Moved, that the foregoing appointments be accepted. Carried.

The Committee continued to meet in the free intervals during the second week of Native Conference, February minth to February four-teenth. Each session was opened with prayer and the following business was transacted.

Moved, that Mr. Sott be transferred to the Triton district (Chaudoc) until the reopening of the Cambodian Bible School, with the understanding that he will return to Battambang to care for the work while Mr. and Mrs. Ellison are at Conference. Carried.

SECOND WEEK

MR. SOTT TRANS-FERED CHAUDOC

CAMBODIAN INTERPRETER Moved, that Mr. Xuong be appointed Cambodian interpreter and colporteur for Chandoc and that his salary be ten plasters per month plus the proceeds of his sales. Carried.

INTERPRETATION OF SCALE FOR NATIVE WORKER'S SALARIES

Moved, that the Committee interpret the scale for native preacher's salaries to mean as follows: a student preacher the has completed his JUNIOR year in Bible Course receives a minimum of twenty piasters per month when in service, INTERMEDIATE year twenty-two piasters, SENIOR year twenty-four plasters. When PREPARATORY students are used their salaries will be fixed by the Executive Committee. Carried.

ON TRIAL

STUDENT EVANCELISTS Moved, that student evangelists on trial be treated as preparatory students. Carried.

BIBLE SCHOOL APPOINTMENTS (FOREIGN)

Moved, that the Committee recommend to the Conference that Mr. Olsen and Wr. Smith be appointed to the Men's Bible School for the school year 1925-26, and that the Chairman be instructed to write to Mr. Olsen informing him of this recommendation.

MISS AILSHOUSE'S FURLOUGH

The Chairman read a letter from the Board stating that Miss Ailshouse's furlough could only be granted on the ground of ill Messrs Irwin and Cadman were therefore deputed to conhealth. sult Miss Ailshouse personally and she definitely stated that her health demands a furlough at once. Moved, that Miss Ailshouse be granted an emergency furlough. Carried.

CAOLANH PROPERTY

Moved, that the Mission advance four hundred plasters to the Cac-Lanh Church to purchase property for the Church built last year. provided the members of said Church make a pledge to return the full amount within three years. This pledge is to be in addition to the regular Church offerings. Carried.

OUTSTATION AT PURSAT

Moved, that Mr. Ellison be authorized to open an outstation at Pursat. Carried.

CHURCH IN SAIGON

Moved, that the Chairman be instructed to write to the Board reiteration the metion of the Committee made February 13, 1923 for an appropriation of money to purchase and build a Church in Carried. Saigon.

VACATION MR. QUOC

Moved, that permission be granted to Mr. Quoc to visit his home in Canton and that his expenses be paid by the Mission.

VACATION MR. THUA.

Moved, that Mr. Thus be granted a vacation and that the Mission pay his expenses to Hong Kong and return.

MR. THUA TO VISIT SOUTH Moved, that Mr. Thus make a special trip to Cochin-China and Cambodia, holding services at all the stations.

MR. TIEP

Moved, that Mr. Tiep replace Mr. Quoc while the latter is in China. Carried.

PRIMARY SCHOOL TOURANE

Moved, that the Mission pay a cash borns of twenty-four plasters per year to the primary school teacher at Tourane. This is in view of the fact that his monthly income from school fees is not sufficient to cover his expenses during the summer vacation.

COLFORTEURS. CERTIFICATES

Moved, that we print certificates in French for colporteurs working in Cochin-China and Cambodia. Carried.

CAMBODIAN COLPORTEUR Moved, that we ratify the Chairman's action in authorizing the hiring of a Cambodian colporteur in Phom Penh. Carried.

OUTSTATION AT

Moved, that Mr. Hammond be authorized to open an outstation at Takeo. Carried.

CAMBODIAN TRANSLATORS Moved, that the Mission pay fifty plasters per month toward the salary of the two Cambodian translators until the same can be collected from the Bible Society. Carried.

BIBLE SCHOOL CLOSING

Moved, that the Men's Bible School close the fifteenth of April, and that all new appointments for student evangelists take effect, at that date in order that they may be on their respective stations before the Missionaries leave for Conference in Hong Kong. Carried.

PLANS FOR PNOM PENH HOUSE Moved, that the plans submitted by Mr. Hammond for the Fnom Penh house be accepted, and that Mr. Hammond be instructed to proceed with the building in collaboration with the Chairman. Carried.

SUMMARY OF THE GOSPEL Moved, that an edition of five thousand "Summary of the Gospel" be printed in Annamese Character. Carried.

NEW TYPE

Moved, that an appeal be made for fifteen hundred dollars gold for two fonts of Annamese and Chinese type. Carried.

ANNAMESE DELEGATES The Executive Committee invited the newly elected Annamese Committee and the delegates to the Foreign Committee to sit with them and discuss matters concerning the native Church and preparations for next year's Native Conference.

TRUNK RACK

Moved, that a white ant proof trunk rack be erected in the store room at Tourane. Carried.

MR. SMITH'S HELPER Moved, that Mr. Smith be authorized to use Mr. Khanh during the summer months to help prepare Bible School notes for the coming year. Carried.

BIBLE SCHOOL SAFE

Moved, that a safe be purchased for the Bible School, Carried.

NORTHERN LAOS TRIP Moved, owing to the shortage of workers, that the authorized trip to Northern Laos be deferred. Carried.

CHING TAK YAM

Moved, that the Chairman's action be ratified in paying one hundred plasters and nine cents expenses for Mr. Ching Tak Yam from Wuchow to Saigon, and also pay his salary of twenty plasters for December 1924 and twenty-five plasters per month for the time that he will be in Cholon. Carried.

CHURCH MANUEL

Moved, that Mr. and Mrs. Cadman be requested to make a translation of the Church Ceremonies contained in the Alliance Manuel and submit it to the next Conference. Carried.

CHURCH CONSTITUTION Moved, that the Church Constitution be printed as per translation submitted. Carried.

PRINTING CHURCH

Moved, that one hundred cloth bound booklets be published containing the Church Constitution and Manuel as accepted by Conference. Carried.

ANNUAL REPORT

Moved, that the Chairman's annual report be printed in English and French. Carried.

DEFICIT IN STUDENT SUPPORT ACCOUNT Moved, that the deficit on the student support account be met by the general fund. Carried.

MINUTES

Moved, that the Minutes be accepted as read. Carried.

ADJOURNMENT

The Committee adjourned with prayer.
