Mrs. Archie Mitchell was born Betty Patzke in Cass Lake, Minnesota on January 12, 1921. She attended Simpson Bible College in San Francisco where she received her degree in 1947.

She married Rev. Archie Mitchell in Bly, Oregon on June 1, 1947. They first went to Viet Nam in 1948. During their third term in Viet Nam, in May of 1962, Mr. Mitchell was captured by Viet Cong troops. Since that time no word has been received on him.

The Mitchells have four children: Rebecca Jane, born on August 24, 1948 is married to Dr. David Thompson, and the couple is under appointment to Cambodia as missionaries. Loretta Jean was born October 24, 1951, Glenn Patrick was born November 5, 1953 and Geraldine Ann was born May 24, 1958.

SURVEY OF WORK ON FIELD:

Rev. A. E. Mitchell went to the Tribes of Viet Nam in February 1948 to serve as a missionary under The Christian and Missionary Alliance. He has completed two terms of service.

The last two years of his first term and the entire  $5\frac{1}{2}$  years of his second term were spent at Dalat, Viet Nam. Here he had the responsibility of the Home and School for Missionary Children. In addition to his administrative responsibilities, he had a very effectual spiritual ministry especially among the children of the Home. It was his privilege to lead many of them to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ and to watch them grow in grace.

Another important phase of his work was that of evangelism during the vacation months when the missionary children returned to their parents. In this ministry he visited many of our mission stations, churches and villages. The manifest blessing of the Lord accompanied his preaching among the Tribes people in the villages, jungles and mountains of Viet Nam. As a result of his two terms of service, many have come to trust in Christ and are now witnessing among their own people.
