Dear Ivory;

Received your telegram and am herewith enclosing in this letter a mandat for \$ 10.50.

Out of this Ten Dollars and a half you take \$4.00.

Two dollars for the month of June and two dollars for the month of July and credit it to Thông. The last Two dollars that I sent you were for the month of May, and the balance is to go to Thay Thong.

When Thầy Thông left here for Saigon I gave him \$5.00, for traveling purposes. I did not have the money to give him for his fare at that time so I wired Robinson to give him \$40.00 of which he did. Now then I am deducting this \$5.00 from his salary, which makes him \$6.50. Because of the \$40.00 Mr. Robinson gave him was plenty for traveling expenses. His fare was \$30.00, so that gave him \$10.00 for traveling expenses which was enough. If I would not deduct this \$5.00 that would make it \$15.00 traveling expenses which is entirely to much.

There is another matter I want to bring to you at this time and that is that, when Thay Dăng left Tourane you gave him \$10.00 traveling expenses. Now then he tells me that you told him that if he did not have enough he should collect from Robinson, he did not collect from Robinson, but he comes to me and says that he used \$12.00 instead of \$10.00 and that he has two dollars more coming. What about this, should I gave it to him or not? Please let me know about it. In your next letter.

Well Ivory the Lord is surely blessing us here in

Mytho and we thank and praise his name for it. Already 18 have been baptised and I am looking forward to baptising more this week. Over 150 have prayed. Many of them come from distances, and it surely seems good to see these people give their hearts to the Lord.

The other day a man of 73 yrs. came and asked about the bible, He said that he had bought a bible many years ago, and he had to burn it, because at that time all those that had the bibles had to burn them. But the old man kept on trusting the best wau he knew how and we were very glad to see him, his beard and hair all grey.

Well It won't be long now until Conference and then we can talk over more things.

My wife sends her regards to you and love to Mrs Jeffrey regards fromeme to you both.
