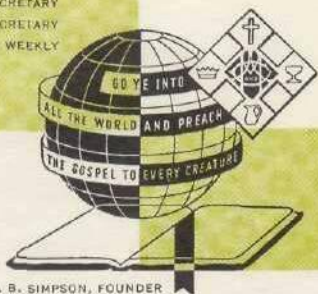

Dear Brother and Sister Van Hine:

I wish to pass on to you an action of the Foreign Department taken in its meeting of March 24-26, as follows:

"That we approve the action of the Sub-Committee on March 12 relative to the status of Rev. and Mrs. J. J. Van Hine who left the field November 14, 1952. It was voted that the furlough allowance of Rev. and Mrs. Van Hine continue until June 30, 1955, provided Mr. Van Hine is free for deputation work as may be arranged by the Bureau of Promotion and Publicity and provided there is need for him in this work during that time."

You will recall that this is the part of our Sub-Committee action which was agreed upon when Mr. Van Hine visited me in my office last week. This is merely to keep our records straight and so that you will know the last action that was taken.

We trust that you are enjoying the presence of the Lord and that from day to day there may be improvement in Mrs. Van Hine's condition.
