3rd. Year. 1st Term. 1923.

1. Board per month, including exercise books and ink...\$ 5.00. This amount is hardly sufficient and may be changed later but will be the rate for this term.
2. A sum of money, to be returned as a monthly allowance, minimum \$2.00 per month, must be deposited by each Student with the Missionary in charge before leaving for Tourme.
This rule applies to all students and married couples whether coming at their own expense or not.
In the case of those whose support is provided for this amount may be paid from that fund if so desired, but only as long as the money is in the treasury.
3. If any assistance is required it will be allowed as so much off for board, but in no case can a man be accepted without a deposit of money as per #2.
4. Except in the case of men who have been Student Preachers for a year, all support of families or relatives must be met apart from Bible School funds.
5. In the case of men who require assistance please write in advance stating the amount of help required.
6. We have no dining accomodation for the wives of Students who come at their own support. Such accomodation must be arranged by the individual students when they arrive.
This accomodation may be provided later.
7. We will do our best to arrange for housing married couples who come at their own expense but must know well in advance of their arrival. No furniture except beds, tables and chairs will be provided.

Dear Fellow Missionaries:

The first two years in the Bible School were happy days but this year in a number of ways is 'better' and we trust that there are also more 'betters' for us in the future.

The old students have made a healthy school atmosphere and the new men have naturally fallen in line. We have divided first and second year men in some subjects but it looks as though all of the men will be able to keep up with the regular work; none are taking a special preparatory course. Senior students take 25 hrs per week and Juniors 18.

The course is as follows: Seniors, O.T., N.T., Camb Hist., Chapter Study, Rom., L. of Christ, Romans, What the Bible Teaches. Juniors: O.T., N.T., Camb Hist Chapter Study, Rom., Life of Christ, Genesis, Bible Keyes. Music is extra. The enrollment of students is 25.

Thus far we have had no serious problems or storms, all has been fair weather and clear sailing with just a couple of small clouds on the horizon. Some of the men do not quite agree with me about it being easy sailing and get up at 4 A.M. to hoist the sails in case they fall behind. It's a regular fishing fleet we are.

I had planned to issue a monthly financial report this year but it is difficult to give a condensed statement as there are so many detailed entries and much of the self support money has been paid in in advance. Our balance stands at about \$600.00 which includes money paid in from all sources. In the future I shall issue receipts for money received. However I understand that the Board has made a number of new rulings in regard to Bible Schools which changes the present arrangement, but I have no instructions yet from Mr. Jaffray or Mr. Irwin.

It was also my intention to issue a monthly bulletin in Annamese for the students who are away from School, but in talking with Mr. Irwin he suggested that since the S.S. lessons are to be issued it would be best to combine the two in one paper. Consequently we are going to send out a monthly magazine, 'LOI SANN HANG' and are charging 10 cents a copy or \$1.00 per year. This is being printed as our duplicator cannot handle it. You are not responsible for the first copies sent to you but if you sell any we shall be glad for the mosh. The second issue will be sent only to those who order and only as many copies as are ordered at the above mentioned prices.

This whole matter will be put before the ~~W.M.F.~~ Executive Committee when it meets next and I trust that there will be a large enough subscription list to justify the Committee taking action to enlarge this magazine and to appoint an editorial committee with editors responsible for various sections. In the meantime Mr. and Mrs. Irwin, Thay Thua and I are issuing this in lieu of separate bulletins.

The Women's Bible School is well under way and Miss Frost is keeping the women busy.

This is quite long enough for any circular letter, so au revoir.
