I am calling because Gene Hall and Jean Jacques Piager arrived this evening from Phnom Penh. Andy Biship, Chuck Falkstad and Robert Beck will be arriving tomorrow morning.

Most of the World Vision staff are moving out tomorrow and the next day or so.

I had the name of Sin Som for one of the Cambodian delegates to the World Alliance Fellowship, but that was a mistake. It should be Son Sonne. It would appear that he is going to be able to get out of the country and is going to be able to attend the AWF meeting Mr. Reach Yea the President has asked permission, and if the city holds, he will come also, but all the predictions are that the city cannot hold for more than another 2 weeks, if that long. We're not sure whether Mr. Reach Yea will make it or not.

Have you had word on the Kroh's arrival there April 10th? In New York. Air France Flight 015.

Barbara Neath will be returning to Canada in about a week. She is with us on a contract basis for Cambodia hospital and since that is now closing out, she is returning and her contract will be terminated with us.

The Catholic Relief Service surgical team which was supposed to move into the hospital in Phnom Penh was held up in Bangkok. So the hospital has not been opened.

The Schelanders arrived in Bangkok today from Saigon. The Paul Ellison's are scheduled to arrive tomorrow.
